Taking care of your reproductive health helps to ensure that you are able to take part in healthy relationships and can maintain a healthy lifestyle. By paying attention to your reproductive health, you can reduce your risk of serious problems such as erectile dysfunction, infertility, and even certain types of cancers. Taking time to learn about your reproductive health and talking to your doctor about any questions or concerns you have is an important step toward maintaining your health.

Men's Health Spotlight: PrEP


Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a safe and effective medication that can reduce your risk of getting HIV.

PrEP may be a good option if you don't have HIV, and:

- You have a sexual partner living with HIV, or
- You don't consistently use condoms, or
- You have been diagnosed with an STD recently, or
- You inject drugs and share needles/equipment with other people, or
- You've used PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) in the past

Family Planning Medicaid covers screening and referral for PrEP, as well as the follow-up visits and testing needed while taking PrEP. Your provider can also help you enroll in the Ready, Set, PrEP program, which covers the cost of your PrEP medication.
