## Most people can get coverage for reproductive health services through Family Planning Medicaid if:

- · You live in North Carolina
- · You are a citizen or qualified immigrant
- · You can become pregnant or cause a pregnancy
- · Your household income\* falls in the chart below:

Single adult	<b>\$2,477</b> per month, or <b>\$29,367</b> per year
Family of 2	<b>\$3,322</b> per month, or <b>\$39,858</b> per year
Family of 3	<b>\$4,196</b> per month, or <b>\$50,349</b> per year
Family of 4	<b>\$5,070</b> per month, or <b>\$60,840</b> per year
Family of 5	<b>\$5,944</b> per month, or <b>\$71,331</b> per year
Family of 6	<b>\$6,819</b> per month, or <b>\$81,822</b> per year

## Covered reproductive health services:

- · Nearly all birth control methods, including:
  - The pill
  - The patch
  - The Depo Provera shot
  - Intrauterine devices (IUDs)
  - Arm implants (Nexplanon)
  - Emergency contraception from a pharmacy
  - Permanent sterilization (vasectomy or tubes tied)
- · Annual physical plus six follow-up visits
- · Labs such as pregnancy tests and pap smears
- Sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment
- The HPV vaccine to prevent cancer
- · Transportation to and from appointments
