Family Planning Medicaid Overview and Updates

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What is Family Planning Medicaid?

 Health coverage plan through Medicaid that covers reproductive health services



- Created in 2005 as a Section 1115 waiver, made permanent in 2014 through a State Plan Amendment
 - Previously known as: Be Smart Medicaid, Family Planning Waiver, Be Smart Family Planning











Individuals are *ineligible* if:










Family Planning Medicaid and Other Medicaid Programs





What does Family Planning Medicaid cover?

TESTS AND LABS

- Pregnancy tests
- Pap smears

BIRTH CONTROL

- · Almost all FDA-approved methods
- Up to a 12-month supply of the pill
- Including emergency contraception

DOCTOR'S VISITS

- Annual Physical Exam
- 6 follow-up visits as needed
- Counseling support for reproductive life planning

STI TESTING/TREATMENT

 For most common sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including gonorrhea, chlamydia, and herpes

What does Family Planning

Medicaid cover?

TRANSPORTATION

 Non-emergency transportation to and from visits

HPV VACCINE

SUPPORT FOR PREP

- FP Medicaid doesn't cover PrEP medication itself, but it will cover the regular visits/labs needed while on it.
- The federal Ready, Set, PrEP program will cover PrEP for free!

STERILIZATION

- Vasectomies and tubal ligations
- In compliance with federal sterilization guidelines

Family Planning Medicaid does not meet Minimum Essential Coverage (MEC) criteria.



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

NC Family Planning Medicaid FACT SHEET FOR PROVIDERS



What is Family Planning Medicaid? Family Planning Medicaid, previously called the "Be Smart" program, is designed to improve the reproductive health of individuals in NC by increasing access to reproductive health services. Reproductive health and contraceptive services are provided to eligible individuals of all genders, regardless of age, whose income is at or below 195% of the federal poverty level.



Why Family Planning Medicaid?

- Free access to nearly all birth control methods
 - 1 in 5 uninsured women reported having to discontinue their preferred method because they could not afford it (KFF, 2022)
 - 17% of low-income women said that cost was the leading reason they were not using their preferred method (KFF, 2022)
- Facilitates reproductive autonomy for individuals wanting to prevent pregnancy
- Supports healthier pregnancies when the time is right
- Promotes population-level sexual health and STI prevention
- Entry point to care and resources
- Bolsters financial sustainability of safety net providers
